NEW BUSINESS

President Alli Calvert opened the floor for new business. Caitlin, the Executive Vice President introduced/proposed the following updates to the bylaws.

President Alli Calvert motioned to the table after spring break. Sophia Romano, Madison Marsh and Maddison Rametta 2nd this motion.

Article II. Object

Previous bylaw:

The object of the Panhellenic Association shall be to develop and maintain women's sorority life and interfraternity relations at a high level of accomplishment and in so doing to:

- A. Consider the goals and ideals of member organizations as applicable to campus and personal life.
- B. Promote superior scholarship and intellectual development.
- C. Cooperate with member women's sororities and the university/college administration to maintain high social and moral standards.
- D. Act in accordance with National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) Unanimous Agreements, policies and best practices.
- E. Act in accordance with such rules established by the Panhellenic Council as to not violate the sovereignty, rights and privileges of member sororities.

Proposed change:

The object of the Panhellenic Association shall be to develop and maintain women's sorority life and interfraternity relations at a high level of accomplishment and in so doing to:

- A. Consider the goals and ideals of member organizations as applicable to campus and personal life.
- B. Promote superior scholarship and intellectual development.
- C. Cooperate with member women's sororities and the university/college administration to maintain high social and moral standards.
 - a. All member women's sororities shall complete an annual Green Dot Bystander Intervention training hosted by UCF Victim Services.
- D. Act in accordance with National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) Unanimous Agreements, policies and best practices.
- E. Act in accordance with such rules established by the Panhellenic Council as to not violate the sovereignty, rights and privileges of member sororities.

Article III. Membership – Section 1. Membership Classes

Proposed change:

There shall be three classes of membership: regular, provisional and associate.

- A. Regular membership. The regular membership of the UCF Panhellenic Association shall be composed of all chapters in good standing of NPC sororities at UCF. Regular members of the College Panhellenic Association shall pay dues as determined by the Panhellenic Council. Each regular member shall have a voice and one vote on all matters.
- B. Provisional membership. The provisional membership of the UCF Panhellenic Association shall be composed of all colonies in good standing of NPC sororities at UCF. Provisional members shall pay no dues and shall have a voice but no vote on all matters. A provisional member shall automatically become a regular member upon being installed as a chapter of an NPC sorority.
- C. Associate membership. Local sororities or inter/national or regional non-NPC member organizations may apply for associate membership of the UCF Panhellenic Association. The membership eligibility requirements and the process for submitting an application and approval of the application shall be determined by the Panhellenic Council. Associate members shall pay dues as determined by the Panhellenic Council. An associate member shall have a voice and one vote on all matters except extension-related matters. If they are not participating in the primary recruitment process, they shall not have a vote on recruitment rules and establishment or modification of Panhellenic total. An associate member may be expelled for cause by a majority vote of the Panhellenic Council. An associate member shall not be entitled to vote on the question of its expulsion.

Note: For chapters to be in good standing with Panhellenic, they must be in good standing with the University of Central Florida. Chapters on Interim Suspension and chapters that have been suspended by their inter/national organization or the university are not considered in good standing with Panhellenic, and thus lose their voting rights for the duration of their suspension.

Article IV. Officers and Duties – Section 1. Officers

Previous bylaw:

The officers of the UCF Panhellenic Association shall be President, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Internal Recruitment, Vice President of External Recruitment, Vice President of Risk Management, Vice President of Public Relations, Vice President of Community Involvement, Vice President of Leadership and Academic Development, Vice President of Recruitment Guides, and Vice President of Administration.

Proposed change:

The officers of the UCF Panhellenic Association shall be President, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Internal Recruitment, Vice President of External Recruitment, Vice President of Risk Management, Vice President of Public Relations, Vice President of Community Involvement, Vice President of Leadership and Academic Development, Vice President of Recruitment Guides, Vice President of Administration, and Vice President of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

Article IV. Officers and Duties – Section 8. Duties of Officers (Pt. 1)

Proposed change:

A. The President shall:

- 1) Have the overall responsibility of UCF's Panhellenic Association's operations.
- 2) Call and preside at all Panhellenic Association's Executive Board meetings, Panhellenic presidents' meetings, and special meetings of the University of Central Florida's Panhellenic Association.
- 3) Serve as ex-officio of all Panhellenic Association committees with voice but no vote.
- 4) Report as required by the National Panhellenic Conference Area Advisor.
- 5) Have the authority to appoint with the approval of the Executive Board ad hoc committee chairs and various other appointed positions.
- 6) Maintain a complete and up-to-date President's file with all pertinent materials.
- 7) Attend All-Presidents meetings and report on behalf of the Panhellenic Association.
- 8) Attend Greek Council meetings and report on behalf of the Panhellenic Association.
- 9) Set the minimum number of office hours for the Panhellenic Executive Council and oversee the fulfillment of the expectations and responsibilities of the summer term.
- 10) Set the expectations for orientation involvement for the Panhellenic Executive Council.
- 11) Preside over all of the Recruitment Team meetings.

Article IV. Officers and Duties – Section 8. Duties of Officers (Pt. 2)

Proposed change:

B. The Executive Vice President shall:

- 1) Perform the duties of the President in her absence, inability to serve, or at her call.
- 2) Oversee the Panhellenic Judicial Board (J. Board), the Interfraternity Council Chair, the National Pan-Hellenic Chair and the Diversified Greek Council Chair.
- 3) Revise the UCF Panhellenic Bylaws and Recruitment Rules annually with the assistance of the Panhellenic Executive Council.
- 4) Approve all Panhellenic Association philanthropy packets and the competition portion of IFC philanthropy packets.
- 5) Receive all infractions and coordinate mediations and Judicial Board hearings.
- 6) Host semesterly Judicial Board trainings.
- 7) Educate Rho Gammas, chapter members, and potential new members about judicial policies/procedures and the MRABA.

D. The Vice President of External Recruitment shall:

- 1) Oversee all marketing efforts for the recruitment process.
- 2) Help in the selection process of the Rho Gammas.
- 3) Approve all publications, advertisements, banners, and signage promoting sorority recruitment.
- 4) Advertise the Panhellenic Association through facilitating and participating in tabling events throughout the spring and summer semesters, leading up to fall Primary Recruitment.
- 5) Select the Primary Recruitment theme by the fourth week of the spring semester.
- 6) Oversee the purchasing of all promotional items and recruitment attire.
- 7) Collaborate with the OFSL staff to represent the Panhellenic Association and the OFSL community at student orientation sessions. Delegate who shall be present for them, either Recruitment Team members or Rho Gammas.
- 8) Serve as a liaison between potential new members and the Panhellenic Community.

Article IV. Officers and Duties – Section 8. Duties of Officers

Previous bylaw:

K. Director of Diversity and Inclusion Duties

- 1) Promote inclusion within member chapters in order to make the Panhellenic community more welcoming and inclusive to individuals from diverse backgrounds.
- 2) Co-coordinate diversity and inclusion programming for chapter members.
- 3) Collaborate with the Director of Public Relations to create content on Diversity and Inclusion. This entails ensuring diverse representation and accessibility with marketing materials.
- 4) Collect and distribute information about campus diversity and inclusion programming and resources.
- 5) Provide referral and support to member chapter's recruitment officers, new member education officers and programming officers regarding diversity and inclusion education.
- 6) Research each month's holidays and history that celebrate Diversity and Inclusion. (i.e. National Hispanic Heritage Month – September, Jewish American Heritage Month – May, Pride Month – June, Black History Month – February).
- 7) Manage the coordination of the Panhellenic Diversity and Inclusion strategic plan. (Effective for the 2022 calendar year)

Proposed change:

K. The Vice President of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion shall:

- 1) Promote inclusion within member chapters in order to make the Panhellenic community more welcoming and inclusive to individuals from diverse backgrounds.
- 2) Co-coordinate diversity and inclusion programming for chapter members.
- 3) Collaborate with the Director of Public Relations to create content on Diversity and Inclusion. This entails ensuring diverse representation and accessibility with marketing materials.
- 4) Collect and distribute information about campus diversity and inclusion programming and resources.
- 5) Provide referral and support to member chapter's recruitment officers, new member education officers and programming officers regarding diversity and inclusion education.
- 6) Research each month's holidays and history that celebrate Diversity and Inclusion. (i.e. National Hispanic Heritage Month – September, Jewish American Heritage Month – May, Pride Month – June, Black History Month – February).
- 7) Manage the coordination of the Panhellenic Diversity and Inclusion strategic plan.

Standing Rules

Previous bylaw:

Philanthropy Restriction

1. Panhellenic organizations are not allowed to host and/or participate in any Greek organization philanthropy event that has more than four expectations of participating organizations; excluding Circle of Sisterhood, Pack to Attack Hunger, IFC Executive Board Philanthropies, and UCF philanthropies.
2. Expectations are considered but not limited to events, partial proceeds, banners, signature campaigns, serenades, fashion shows, carwashes, food events, donation drives, social media campaigns, decoration competitions, dance competitions, and any additional task imposed on an organization. Apparel, Registration Fees, Monetary Donation Campaigns, and Event ticket sales are not considered expectations.
 - a. Any questions on whether something is considered an expectation should be directed to the Panhellenic Vice President of Community Involvement.
3. Chapters may not receive wet events as reward for winning a philanthropic event.
4. If organizations are found guilty of breaking this amendment they will be subject to a Judicial Board Hearing.

Proposed change:

Philanthropy Restriction

Section 1. Participation & Expectations

- A.** Panhellenic organizations are not allowed to host and/or participate in any Greek organization philanthropy event that has more than four expectations of participating organizations; excluding Circle of Sisterhood, Pack to Attack Hunger, IFC Executive Board Philanthropies, and UCF philanthropies.
- B.** Expectations are considered but not limited to events, partial proceeds, banners, signature campaigns, serenades, fashion shows, carwashes, food events, donation drives, social media campaigns, decoration competitions, dance competitions, and any additional task imposed on an organization. Apparel, Registration Fees, Monetary Donation Campaigns, and Event ticket sales are not considered expectations.
 - a. Any questions on whether something is considered an expectation should be directed to the Panhellenic Vice President of Community Involvement.
- C.** Chapters may not receive wet events as reward for winning a philanthropic event.
- D.** If organizations are found guilty of breaking this amendment they will be subject to a Judicial Board Hearing.

Section 2. Approval

1. All philanthropy competition packets must be submitted via email to the Executive Vice President. The Executive Vice President shall have a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of five (5) business days to complete her review of the packet and confirm whether or not the packet is in accordance with Section 1 of the Philanthropy Restriction Standing Rule.
2. If the packet is found to be in agreement with the Philanthropy Restriction Standing Rule, the Executive Vice President shall notify the proper chapter delegate that the packet is approved and ready for distribution to other chapters. If it is found to violate the Philanthropy Restriction Standing Rule, the Executive Vice President shall notify the proper chapter delegate of the violation and remand the packet for revision as it is unapproved.
 - a. Unapproved packets may be revised and sent back to the Executive Vice President in accordance with Section 1 of the Philanthropy Restriction Standing Rule. The Executive Vice President shall follow the procedures of Sections 1-2 of the Philanthropy Restriction Standing Rule.

UCF Panhellenic Council Recruitment Rules – Section 3: Chapter

Previous rule:

19. Financial

- a. The recruitment budget will not exceed \$6,500.00 total, not including the cost of the outdoor tent and chair rental for PNMs, UCF Day shirts, Recruitment Guide Refreshments, PNM water bottles, chair and table rentals, and Bid Day costs. This budget does include the cost of the Video Day chapter video.
- b. A budget audit must be completed and turned in within 2 weeks of Bid Day to the Panhellenic Vice President of Administration. There will be a \$50.00 fine for the first week it is late and an additional \$10.00 for every week thereafter.
- c. All chapters must submit documentation and receipts for all recruitment related expenses to the Panhellenic Vice President of Internal Recruitment by the Friday following Bid Day at 5:00 pm.
- d. Donated items need to be appraised and included in the budget based on their value.

Proposed change:

19. Financial

- a. The recruitment budget will not exceed \$6,500.00 total, not including the cost of the outdoor tent and chair rental for PNMs, UCF Day shirts, Recruitment Guide refreshments, PNM water bottles, chair and table rentals, and Bid Day costs. This budget does include the cost of the **Sisterhood Day** chapter video.
- b. A budget audit must be completed and turned in within 2 weeks of Bid Day to the Panhellenic Vice President of Administration. There will be a \$50.00 fine for the first week it is late and an additional \$10.00 for every week thereafter.
- c. All chapters must submit documentation and receipts for all recruitment related expenses to the

Panhellenic Vice President of Internal Recruitment by the Friday following Bid Day at 5:00 p.m.
d. Donated items need to be appraised and included in the budget based on their value.

UCF Panhellenic Council Recruitment Rules – Section 5: Formal Recruitment Structure

Previous rule:

3. Round 3 – Video Day

- a. This round is designated as Video Day
- b. Attire for this round will be as follows:
 - i. Chapters' discretion in terms of clothes and shoes they wear.
 - ii. Chapters may not require their members to wear identical outfits.
- c. Beverages for this round are open to anything non-alcoholic.
 - i. Bottled water, or water in plain plastic cups, must be served upon the Potential New Member's request.
- d. No food of any kind is allowed during this Round.
- e. House tours are allowed during this Round.
- f. Decorations will be limited to:
 - i. Video screen décor, one unique aspect of organization
 - ii. If wall décor is chosen as the unique aspect, wall decorations may only cover one wall.
 - iii. If centerpieces are chosen, centerpieces must be consistent throughout the room being used.
